




WHAT WE OFFER

Education Courses:



AZA and other accredited institutions use SSP programs to maintain healthy populations in managed care. Now, more than ever, institutions are relying on wildlife care staff to not only care for the wildlife at their institutions, but to care for the well being of the species as a whole, and ensure populations are maintained appropriately.



WHAT YOU WILL DO

You will speak directly with an SSP Coordinator to learn how these programs are put into action at SDZWA. You will visit our famous Rhino Rescue Center, where one of these SSP programs are at work, and see our Frozen Zoo to learn how wildlife care combined with breaking edge science can help save species.

WHAT YOU WILL DO

You will have the opportunity to speak directly with our Applied Wildlife Welfare Manager and will take a similar course that all SDZWA wildlife care staff take to improve our ability to help guests understand how we ensure our wildlife are thriving. You will learn how to rate wildlife's welfare on a continuum from good to poor and make changes based on your results.

WILDLIFE WELFARE

Using behavioral, medical, and environmental research, welfare can be measured on a continuum from good to poor. Every zoo and aquarium employee should be able to define wildlife welfare, understand the Five Opportunities to Thrive model and cite the differences between wildlife welfare and animal rights.

HORTICULTURE AND NUTRITION

Each species of wildlife has their own specific nutritional needs to keep them healthy and strong. Nutritionists are in charge of creating the menus for every individual on grounds and they adjust these menus based on the needs of the individual. Horticulture cares for thousands of plant species required to keep our wildlife happy and healthy. Many of these plant species are rare around the world.



WHAT YOU WILL DO

You will speak directly with our Nutritionist Specialists, learning how they formulate and maintain wildlife diets. You will also have the opportunity to see where all of the food is stored and prepared, and will get a special tour of the kinds of plant wildlife we house on and off grounds. You will learn from experts in the field of horticulture and plant science and see our cutting edge research that allows us to maintain and restore plant populations.

WHAT YOU WILL DO

Receiving a similar course that all Wildlife
Care Specialists at SDZWA receive, you will
take the Wildlife Behavior class with the
Curator of Behavioral Husbandry, Nicki
Boyd. You will learn how to shape behavior
through operant conditioning, and
experience what it's like to work WITH
wildlife to maintain their optimal core.

WILDLIFE BEHAVIOR

Historically, the idea of training only came to mind when thinking about wildlife that participated in shows and education settings. However, husbandry training is one of the most important aspects of a Wildlife Care Specialist's job. By allowing wildlife to participate in their own medical care, procedures are safer and more rewarding for the wildlife that participate. Wildlife Care Specialists can do regular health checks on individuals to ensure their health and well being. In addition, training programs stimulate the individual's mind allowing them to continue to learn and problem solve.

INTERPRETATION TRAINING

One job that all employees that work for a zoological association share, is to help visitors have an enjoyable zoo experience, gain a greater understanding and appreciation of wildlife, and learn about the zoo and its purpose. This is done through proper interpretation. Your skills as an effective interpreter can create a crucial moment that increases a visitors conservation knowledge and desire to save wildlife.

Taught by one of our professional interpreters, you will learn the skills necessary to effectively communicate our Mission and Vision to zoo guests. Through these purposeful, meaningful, and relevant communication tools, you will gain the ability to broaden perspectives, inspire change, and deepen understanding of those around you.


